
THE CLOSED SANDWICH







NOW HAMMER LOTS OF NAILS ALONG AN OLD FRAME,

AND CRISS-CROSS IT WITH SOME THREAD








NOW RELEASE THE SANDWICH AND GIVE IT A COAT OF GLUE

WE CAN USE READY-CRISS-CROSS (A.K.A. A MESH FABRIC) FOR THIS ONE







PLACE THE FABRIC ON THE PAPER AND GIVE IT ANOTHER COAT OF VARNISH


TRIM IT NEAT & CLEAN

THIS ONE'S READY TO GO TOO!






EITHER WAY, OUR 'INK' IS A GOEEY-STICKY PASTE!




IT CAN BE MADE FROM STARCHES, GUMS, CLAYS, or STARCHY-GUMMY-CLAYS!

ON A CLOTH, PASTE, STENCIL,










